





Abstract Indian Cancer Society: Innovative Funding of Cancer Treatment More than 10 years and three investment rounds after it had created a new model for fundraising-through which more than 5,000 donors had

contributed towards a cause that had impacted 11,054 lives, with a total disbursement of INR 184 crore

earnings on a huge amount of corpus were close to negligible, and the dwindling interest and dividend rates had made it challenging to get a reasonable return. Earlier, dividends from debt funds were tax-free for the investor and the Dividend Distribution Tax was payable by the fund. In 2020, these dividends became taxable in the hands of the recipient at their marginal tax rate. Thus, the mutual fund model adopted in 2010 was no longer practical for philanthropy funding.
