

Project "Satark" focuses on spreading awareness about Oral, Cervical, and Breast cancer through a structured approach. The project involves training doctors, followed by capacity building of ASHA workers who then engage with communities to raise awareness and motivate individuals for cancer screening.

Indian Cancer Society (ICS) launches Cancer Awareness Training Program in collaboration with the Karnataka Govt. under the Tata Power project

A three-day training program was conducted in Gadag district of Karnataka between 18th to 20th August 2025 to train their Medical Officers and Community Health Officers on oral, breast, and cervical cancer awareness and prevention modules, equipping them with knowledge and skills to further train frontline healthcare workers in their respective region.




Ganesh Utsav and Navratri festival celebration in Satark Districts

During the Ganpati festival, the community gathering was leveraged to conduct cancer awareness activities focusing on oral, breast, and cervical cancers—their symptoms, early detection, and preventive measures. The team also celebrated the festival through innovative awareness initiatives, including an online quiz, essay competition, street plays, banner displays, and an awareness rally, encouraging active community participation and engagement.


Health Rally in Nashik

The health rally was conducted with school children, including 17 schools of 5 locations (Blocks), and the enthusiastic participation of students and teachers. The event focused on promoting early cancer screening and a healthy lifestyle. **Total reach of this activity is 14300**



Online Cancer Quiz in Nashik

The virtual cancer quiz was designed for ASHA workers based on a flip chart. A Google Form was created for participation. Out of 138 registered workers, 64 submitted the form on time. Two participants scored 20 out of 20, while eight scored 19 out of 20.



Awareness in Satark Districts

Awareness banners were placed in the Ganpati mandaps at various locations of different blocks to educate visitors about cancer symptoms, screening methods, and prevention. This ensured that everyone visiting the site had access to important health information. **Approximately 22,000 people** visited at these various locations in Nashik, Goa and Mumbai.

Street plays were performed at five locations to spread awareness about cancer symptoms, treatment options, and lifestyle changes. The performances encouraged interaction and opened discussions among community members. **Approximate reach is 1049.**



Primary Health Centre (PHC) Displays Driving Cancer Awareness

Posters on Oral, Cervical and Breast Cancer were put up at all 37 Primary Health Centres, across 5 Talukas of Nashik district. Patients and visitors at PHCs get continuous visual reminders, which helps in spreading awareness even beyond program activities.

Actress Sai Tamhankar Supports Cancer Awareness Campaign

Renowned actress Sai Tamhankar extended her support to the Indian Cancer Society's cancer awareness campaign, encouraging people to stay alert, go for regular check-ups, and focus on early detection. Her message reinforces the importance of awareness and vigilance in the fight against cancer.




BENGALURU BRANCH - Awareness




KOLKATA BRANCH - Awareness Programme


Capacity Building Programme

APAC Survey



Fridays with Shrenik



With interactive polls and Q&A sessions, the program was well-received and truly engaging.



Cancer SCREENING



ICS NHO has implemented a community-based preventive cancer screening program across Mumbai, Mumbai Suburban, Navi Mumbai, Thane and Nashik districts of Maharashtra, with CSR support from Larsen & Toubro (L&T) and Axis Bank, during the period July to September 2025.

A total of 2,622 individuals were screened through 46 cancer screening camps, comprising 30% males and 70% females. As part of cervical cancer screening, 1,767 HPV DNA tests were conducted.

Approximately 8% of the participants were identified as screen-positive, and follow-up evaluations are currently in progress.

Additionally, six Medical Officers (MOs) and Community Health Officers (CHOs) have been trained through hands-on sessions to strengthen local screening and diagnostic capacity.




**CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING**

From July to September, 2025 total 23 women were screened for Cervical Cancer by HPV DNA test.


BREAST CANCER SCREENING

For screening of Breast Cancer ICS Kolkata in association with CNCI have been arranging Mobile Mammography services, from July to September, 2025 total 10 women were screened.




SURVIVORSHIP & REHABILITATION
