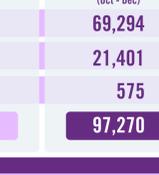

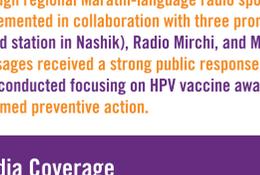

## BREAST CANCER & HPV VACCINE CAMPAIGN

### Social Media Campaign

To mark the breast cancer awareness month we launched the new BREAST CANCER awareness campaign. In November, we promoted the HPV VACCINE campaign. Social media platforms were leveraged and that helped to reach more than 11 million views across platforms.

### National Cinema Campaign

The Cancer Awareness campaign through cinema theatres was implemented across select cities to promote early detection through impactful storytelling. Short awareness films screened in cinemas reached diverse audiences, encouraging preventive health behaviours and regular screening helping reduce fear around cancer. By bringing awareness into community spaces like cinemas, the campaign aimed to spark conversations and motivate people to stay two steps ahead of cancer.

The four-week campaign was rolled out across over 500 screens in 33 locations, in two phases - Breast Cancer awareness in the first fortnight, followed by a 30-second film on the HPV vaccine. The films were aired in regional languages including Hindi, Marathi, Telugu, Kannada, and Bengali.



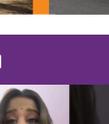
### Radio Campaign



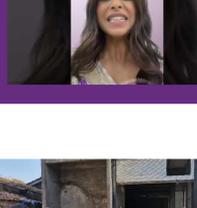
The Radio Awareness Campaign in Nashik was executed to spread cancer awareness across the district through regional Marathi-language radio spots, ensuring wide and effective outreach. The campaign was implemented in collaboration with three prominent radio stations - Radio Vishwas (a popular community based station in Nashik), Radio Mirchi, and MY FM - to maximise reach and engagement. The awareness messages received a strong public response. In addition, an expert radio interview with Dr. Gauravi Mishra was conducted focusing on HPV vaccine awareness, addressing common questions and encouraging informed preventive action.

### Media Coverage

Project SATARK, supported by HDFC Bank Parivartan, was successfully rolled out in Satara, receiving encouraging media coverage across Maharashtra. Under this CSR initiative, more than 170 medical and community health officers have already been trained, and the training of frontline workers is currently underway. Over 1,400+ frontline workers are expected to complete their training by the second week of January 2026, strengthening grassroots cancer awareness and early detection efforts in the district. To amplify outreach, extensive media engagement was initiated through regional print and online platforms across Maharashtra.



Additionally, the media coverage highlighting the launch of the Breast Cancer Awareness film in October, observed as Breast Cancer Awareness Month, was well received, with several media houses covering the launch extensively through online platforms.

### Bus Branding

The Indian Cancer Society (ICS) initiated a bus branding awareness campaign across both city and rural buses in the Nashik district to promote awareness of Oral, Breast, and Cervical Cancer. The campaign covered Nashik City as well as surrounding regions including Simar, Trimbakeshwar, Igatpuri, and Dindori. Bus branding proved to be a highly effective awareness medium due to its continuous movement, high visibility, and repeated exposure across urban and rural routes. By leveraging an extensive public transport network, the campaign reached a large and diverse population on a daily basis, reinforcing key messages on cancer awareness, early detection, and screening, while also strengthening public trust in the ICS as a reliable support system for cancer patients and their families.



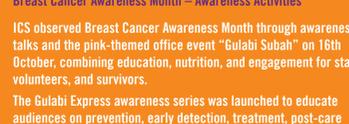
### Actress Sai Tamhankar Supports Cancer Awareness Campaign

### Street Play (Nukkad Natak)

Street plays (Nukkad Natak) were conducted across various locations within the project area to create awareness about Oral, Cervical, and Breast Cancer through an engaging and culturally relevant script. The performances focused on early signs, symptoms, and preventive measures, and received an encouraging response with active participation from the community. We were able to reach a total of 11,012 people.



### Social Media Campaign

Social media was leveraged to not only create awareness for Oral, Cervical, and Breast Cancer, along with HPV vaccination across platforms resulting in a good engagement and total reach of 18 million+ Also relevant engaging social media posts to sustain audience interest and support outreach efforts. These included festival-based creatives around occasions such as Diwali, Christmas and New Year, as well as donation-focused and informational posts aimed at encouraging public participation & support.



### DELHI BRANCH - Awareness

#### Breast Cancer Awareness Month - Awareness Activities

ICS observed Breast Cancer Awareness Month through awareness talks and the pink-themed event fest "Gulabi Subah" on 16th October, combining education, nutrition, and engagement for staff, volunteers, and survivors.



The Gulabi Express awareness series was launched to educate audiences on prevention, early detection, treatment, post-care support, and to address social stigma, and was shared widely across ICS social media platforms.



ICS conducted a "Meet the Expert" session in New Delhi featuring Prof. (Dr.) Deepika Dhamija, focusing on lymphedema awareness, prevention, and management for patients and caregivers.



ICS also participated in an online webinar hosted by Medanta - The Medicity, Gurugram, where myths around breast cancer and psychosocial coping were discussed by experts, including Mrs. Indra Jasuja.



An interactive meeting of Delhi NH hospital volunteers was held to share experiences, identify the need for hospital-specific accompaniments, improve exposure to palliative care counselling, and explore ways to strengthen ICS's presence across partner hospitals, with follow-up sub group meetings proposed.



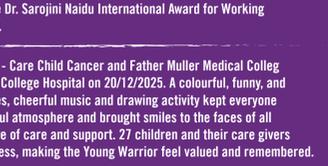
#### Conversations in Cancer Care

National Institute of Health & Family Welfare (NIHFV) held a day-long seminar on "Difficult Conversations: Navigating Challenging Situations While Interacting with Cancer Patients." The panel, moderated by Dr. Ranjna, Medical Oncologist from Melbourne, included Dr. Upreet Dhalivai, Ophthalmologist from Pune; Dr. Dheeraj Shah from NIHFV; and Mrs. Indra Jasuja from ICS. It was an engaging and interactive session.



#### ICS-FICCI Cancer Care Roundtable

The Indian Cancer Society, in collaboration with FICCI, hosted a high impact roundtable on "Next Gen Cancer Care: Reimagining Lung & Breast Cancer Treatment in India," bringing together policymakers, clinicians, insurers, patient advocates, and survivors. The discussion focused on gaps in insurance coverage, access to modern treatments, and rising financial toxicity, with the aim of shaping patient-centric insurance models, streamlined claims, and inclusion of innovative therapies, leading to actionable recommendations and a white paper for equitable cancer care in India.



#### ICS-FICCI Cancer Care Roundtable

ICS participated in a national consultation on "Targets: Multi-Sectoral Action for Cervical Cancer Elimination," organised by NCI-AIIMS in collaboration with IIT Delhi and UNICEF India, bringing together key stakeholders to advance India's cervical cancer elimination goals.



Mrs. Jyotsna Govil, Chairperson, represented ICS Delhi at an international conference on Cell & Gene Therapy in India, where she delivered a patient centric address on ethical concerns, trust, and transparency in emerging therapies, reinforcing ICS's role in advocacy and informed dialogue.



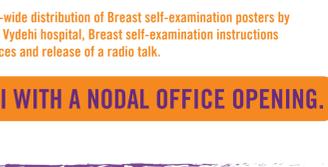
#### ASCO Palliative Care Course Impact

The ASCO Palliative Care Course - India was held in a hybrid format in November 2025, with follow-up virtual sessions in December, focusing on palliative care skills, ethical decision-making, communication, and emotional resilience. Mrs. Rajvinder Kaur represented the Indian Cancer Society, Delhi Branch, and the programme reinforced compassionate, patient-centred palliative care practices.



#### Fridays with Shrenik

Fridays with Shrenik is an interactive awareness initiative by the Indian Cancer Society, conducted on alternate Fridays at 4:00 PM via Zoom and YouTube. Hosted by Mr. Shrenik, the sessions feature medical experts, survivors, and caregivers discussing cancer awareness, treatment, emotional well-being, and lifestyle management in a supportive and engaging format. In December, sessions covered Cancer Related to the Urinary Tract by Dr. Ashwin Mallaya (5th Dec) and Radiotherapy's Role in Saving Organs by Dr. Samir Batham (19th Dec).



#### Patient Support Group Meeting

A patient support group session on Nutrition and Lifestyle in Cancer Treatment was held on 26 Dec via Zoom with 42 patients and survivors, highlighting balanced nutrition, healthy habits, and myth-busting for better recovery and well-being.



#### ICS Delhi at AIIMS Cancer Lecture

ICS Delhi attended the "Prevention to Palliation" public lecture at AIIMS on 6th November 2025, focusing on cancer, early detection, treatment, and palliative care. Ms. Priya Tiwari and Ms. Ritika represented ICS Delhi, supporting ongoing national cancer awareness efforts.



## Cervical Cancer Elimination Consortium-India (CCEC - I) Consultation

A colourful, funny, and entertaining puppet show was enjoyed by the children. The lively voices, cheerful music and drawing activity kept everyone engaged throughout the show. Overall, the puppet show created a joyful atmosphere and brought smiles to the faces of all the children. Santa Claus gave gift bags to Young Warriors as a gesture of care and support. 27 children and their care givers participated in the program. The moment brought comfort and happiness, making the Young Warrior feel valued and remembered.

On 16th Nov, ICS organised the first ever 'Can4Cancer' run, which originated in Australia. The purpose of this event was to raise awareness and funds for the cause. Approx 500 runners and walkers, all employees of Commonwealth Bank of Australia, participated with great enthusiasm. The senior leadership of CBA commended ICS for the work being done on the ground. The event is an initiative of CBA.



On 16th Oct, Jain University students held their third annual event titled "CANCARE" on campus to spread awareness and to promote survivorship. The 4-day event featured clinical breast examination of their staff and students, artful activities to spark creativity in cancer awareness, and interaction with an oncologist and survivors on the final day.

### KOLKATA BRANCH - Awareness Programme

ICS Kolkata undertaken a project named 'Raising Awareness and Detecting Cancer amongst rural under privileged population' at different villages of Mathurapur Block I in Sundarban Region of South 24 parganas district. The project is funded by CREST Digital India Pvt. Ltd.

Objectives of this project:  
• To raise awareness among communities on issues related to cancers;  
• To increase the suspected seeking behaviour among communities;  
• To identify the treatment cancer patients through organizing cancer detection and awareness camps

Activities under this project:  
• Sensitization meeting with frontline health workers (like ASHA, ANM, Community Health Asst., Trained Dai etc.)  
• Organizing cancer awareness and detection camps;  
• Financial support for needy detected patients & referral and linkage of the cancer patients.

From October to December, 2025 we conducted 17 Sensitization meeting with ASHA Workers, Community Health Asst., Community Health officer, ANM and Trained Dai, through these programmes we reached amongst 266 health workers.

During October to December, 2025, We conducted 20 Awareness programs on cancer amongst community members, through these programs we reached among 1936 individuals out of which 464 were male and 1469 were female.

## NAVEEN KSHATRIYA MEDICAL EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

Together, we move one step closer to eliminating cervical cancer.

On Saturday, 27th Sept 2025, the Indian Cancer Society, in collaboration with SMBT Hospital, Nashik successfully hosted a Naveen Kshatriya Medical Empowerment Program (NKMEP) focused on Cervical Cancer Awareness, HPV Vaccination, and Screening.

Our expert panellists shared valuable insights on prevention, early detection, and patient care, highlighting the crucial role of family physicians in supporting patients through their cancer journey.

The program also demonstrated a significant improvement in participants' knowledge levels, as reflected in the pre- and post-session assessments.



## RELAY FOR LIFE 2025 - A WALK OF HOPE

Community in Action  
The Indian Cancer Society hosted Relay For Life 2025 at JBCN International School, Mumbai, an initiative of the American Cancer Society, bringing together students, teachers, survivors, and supporters.

Key Highlights  
The Pre-RFL on 11th October featured joyful activities and donation stalls with handmade products by cancer survivors and their families. The main relay on 15th October included performances, games, survivor participation, and an awareness talk on breast, cervical, and oral cancers.

A Moment of Reflection  
The event concluded with a touching Luminaria Ceremony, honoring cancer warriors and reinforcing hope for a cancer-free future.



# Cancer SCREENING



ICS National Head Quarter (NHQ) is being implementing successfully a community-based preventive cancer screening programme across Mumbai & Mumbai Suburban areas, Navi Mumbai, Sinar Block (Nashik District), and Satara Block of Maharashtra, with generous CSR support from L&T, Axis Bank, and HDFC Bank Parivartan and collaboration with respective government health department. The programme has been operational from October to December 2025 and is continuing on the ground, strengthening early detection and access to cancer prevention services for underserved communities.

Through 60 community-level cancer screening camps, a total of 3,446 individuals were screened, comprising 21% men and 79% women. The screening focused on early detection of common cancers, with special emphasis on cervical cancer, for which HPV DNA sample collection was carried out using evidence-based screening protocols.

### Built-in Quality Assurance Mechanisms

- To ensure accuracy, reliability, and patient safety, ICS NHQ has embedded robust quality assurance and quality control measures throughout programme implementation through Preventive Oncology Department, Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH):
  - Standardised screening protocols and Standard operating processes (SOPs) were followed across all camps to maintain uniformity in service delivery.
  - Trained medical and paramedical teams conducted screenings, with regular supervision and on-site monitoring to ensure protocol adherence.
  - Quality checks for HPV DNA sample collection, labelling, storage, and transport were systematically implemented to minimise pre-analytical errors.
  - Data quality reviews were carried out to ensure completeness, consistency, and traceability of screening records.

Early Detection Saves Lives: Most cancers, when detected early, are highly treatable and often curable. Screening camps help identify cancer at an early or even pre-cancerous stage, when the chances of survival are significantly higher. This is especially crucial for cancers like breast, cervical, oral, and colorectal, which are often silent in the early stages.

## KOLKATA BRANCH - Screening

### DETECTION CAMP

From October,2025 to December,2025 we have conducted 20 detection camps on cancer, through these camps we reached among 1816 community members out of which 427 were male and 1389 were female.



### HPV TEST FOR DETECTING CERVICAL CANCER

For detecting Cervical Cancer, ICS Kolkata in association with CNCI Kolkata planned to involve a greater number of underprivileged women for HPV Test. From October to December,2025 total 268 women were screened for Cervical Cancer by HPV DNA test.



### Mobile Mammography Services

From October,2025 to December,2025 we conducted 9 mobile mammography services for detecting of breast cancer, total 60 women were screened by Mammogram



### Observation of National Cancer Awareness Day

On the occasion of National Cancer Awareness Day, we conducted an awareness programme on 7th November,2025 amongst ASHA workers and other community members at Mathurapur in South 24 parganas District. During this programme our cancer specialist gave an awareness talk about the importance of the day and also about the importance of cancer screening, we also distributed the leaflets on cancer amongst the participants. Total 98 individuals were participated out of which 67 female and 31 male.

## DELHI BRANCH

The consultative meeting on Cancer Care Advocacy, organised by the National Cancer Registry Programme (NCRP), was held on 13th December at Committee Room 149, IRCH, AIIMS, New Delhi, to strengthen collaboration between NCRP and non-governmental organisations (NGOs) engaged in cancer care and patient support. The meeting commenced with a welcome address by Dr. Sunil Kumar, Head, Delhi Cancer Registry, who emphasised the importance of coordinated advocacy involving cancer registries, healthcare providers, and NGOs. Dr. Prashant Mathur, Director, National Centre for Disease Informatics and Research (NCDIR), Bengaluru, presented an overview of NCRP and its outreach initiatives, highlighting the role of cancer registry data in evidence based cancer control planning. A session on the Delhi Cancer Registry, led by Dr. Sunil Kumar and Dr. Hari Sagiraju, discussed experiences beyond routine data collection and underscored the need for multi-stakeholder engagement, particularly in Jhajjar, to strengthen advocacy efforts. Representatives from Rotary IRCH, Indian Cancer Society, PCI, Can Support, CAPEd, and CANKIDS shared brief inputs on their activities, challenges in patient support, and advocacy experiences. The meeting concluded with an interactive discussion emphasizing the need for stronger NCRP-NGO linkages, data-driven advocacy, and sustained collaboration to enhance patient-centered cancer care. Ms. Rajvinder kaur, Patient Engagement Officer, and Mrs. Ranjit Kaur, Senior Volunteer, attended the meeting.

The session included engagement activities, a motivational talk, round table discussions, an introduction to support group models, and heartfelt sharing circles. The initiative also provided survivors with a platform to begin forming a support group, highlighted the voices of women who took the pledge, and shared key information on WHO's Cervical Cancer Elimination goals and the importance of the HPV vaccine.

Organised in line with the WHO's global theme of eliminating cervical cancer, the support group reinforced collective action through awareness, survivor-led dialogue, and prevention-focused messaging.

The conference emphasized translating evidence into sustainable, culturally relevant pediatric cancer care.

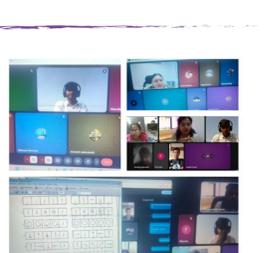


## Career Assessment & Guidance for Survivors

The Indian Cancer Society continues to support childhood and adolescent cancer survivors through structured career assessment and counselling.

Since 2023, nearly 70 students across ICS programmes have benefited from aptitude-based assessments, personalised guidance, and parental counselling.

Delivered through online and offline formats, the initiative also offers select internship and placement support- reinforcing ICS's commitment to holistic survivorship, career readiness, and long-term well-being.



## Tiny Miracle Project

Under the Tiny Miracle Project, 52 cancer survivors and caregivers are actively involved in producing bags. This initiative provides them with the opportunity to work from home, enabling flexibility while ensuring a dignified and sustainable source of income. The participants are highly motivated and happy to be part of the project. Under this project, we plan to produce a total of 30,000 bags.



## Creating Livelihoods Through Handcrafted Bags

This quarter was especially meaningful as, during the festive season, ICS Mumbai, set up stalls at various locations including Raymond, Kotak Bank, Cipla, Bhavya Grahak Peth, JBCN School, and Dhirubhai Ambani International School.
