

UGAM PROFILE

Indian Cancer Society was established in 1951 by Dr. D. J. Jussawalla and Mr. Naval Tata as India's first voluntary, non-profit, National Organization for Awareness, Detection, Cure and Survivorship of those affected with this disease. UGAM, Emotional support group of childhood cancer survivors, is the youngest unit of (ICS) under its survivorship program. UGAM means "To Rise", underscoring the determination of childhood cancer survivors, to rise above all obstacles in life & be VICTORS.UGAM has been set up with an aim to provide empowerment to the survivors of childhood cancers & to spread the message "Childhood Cancer is Curable" in society .Ugam was launched in 2009 on the first Sunday of June celebrated as Cancer Survivors Day across the world as a mark of celebration of life.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: Childhood Cancer Survivors more than 14 years of age and more than 2 years from completion of cancer therapy with disease free status and registered at ACT (After completion of Therapy) Clinics of Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH). Ugam is expanding its wings to include servivers from ACT clinic of pediatric units at other hospitals.

- Help childhood cancer survivors to begin new life after cancer treatment and to make them aware that there can be and there is "normal life" after winning the battle with cancer
- Promote the importance of monitoring of monitoring the late effects of cancer therapies.

Greetings from Ugam on its 8th Anniversary Celebrations!

The survivorship programme of ICS has been growing from strength to strength & spreading its wings to include Mumbai based pediatric cancer units under its fold in first phase & then scale it up to pan India level.

Project PICASSO(Partnership in Cancer survivorship Optimization) was launched by ICS in partnership with HES Infra Pvt Ltd under their corporate social responsibility last year with an aim to develop a cancer survivorship module for holistic care of Childhood cancer survivors in partnership with pediatric cancer units who will look after their medical needs based on ACT clinic at TMH & Ugam at ICS model.

We have identified besides TMH, other potential partners as Sion Hospital, Wadia Hospital. The hospital will setup the ACT clinic for childhood Cancer Survivors.ICS will provide professional and technical assistance to childhood cancer survivors in ACT clinic to enable them to live a productive life. This will include the following facilities to cancer survivors without any charges

- Identifying survivor's need
- Psycho Social Counseling
- Career Counseling / aptitude tests if required
- Registering them as Ugam members
- Funding for education if required
- Soft skills development programme for job readiness
- Facilitating job placements
- Survivorship information material

ICS is fortunate to have financial support of

WPP India CSR Foundation to adopt eligible childhood cancer survivors for educational funding and hand hold them through whatever it takes to make them fully rehabilitated back into the society. The talent discovery would be a part of counselling. Emphasis would be given to girl cancer survivor who are vulnerable & underprivileged in our society.

ICS has been able to partner with Tatastrive (Tata community trust) & Edubridge to reintegrate survivors into society by rebuilding their confidence and enabling them to resume normal working lives. Edubridge would be conducting domain courses like Business Process Outsourcing — Customer Relationship Management) (112 hours) at the end of which students will be provided with placement opportunities. They have also offered to conduct Youth Development Module (80 hr) courses in which students will be trained with the skills necessary to be job ready.

ICS-Ugam as member of Childhood Cancer International (CCI) endorses The Dublin Declaration & reiterates that With the support and commitment of all stakeholders, childhood cancer survivors can be actively engaged in society and live their lives to the fullest.



THE DECLARATION OF DUBLIN, IRELAND

Surviving childhood cancer can be a lifelong challenge, regardless of geographical, religious, ethnic, financial and cultural backgrounds. We, the global CCI Survivors Network, ask medical and psychosocial professionals and all other stakeholders to acknowledge the challenges and needs of survivors.

Survivors of childhood cancer may develop medical and psychosocial late effects that severely impact their quality of life. Therefore, comprehensive long-term follow-up care is essential. We ask that adequate long-term follow-up clinics are established, where survivors can have access to personalized follow-up care. We ask for more research on late effects so that survivor care services can be improved.

Inadequate transition from childhood cancer care to adult medical care can result in a lack of knowledge and understanding of the impact and consequences of childhood cancer by the treating health professional(s). It is essential that these health professionals have a thorough understanding of the needs of cancer survivors. We request for full disclosure and sharing of our medical history and potential risks to our current and future health.

We emphasize the importance of trustworthy and empathetic psychosocial support during and after treatment. We ask all involved with our long-term care to be forthcoming and honest with us and to take our issues seriously.

In some countries, survivors are stigmatized and experience discrimination. We ask for equal opportunities in society including, but not limited to, education, employment and insurance.

Although cancer is a major cause of death amongst children around the world, it is important to convey to the general public that childhood cancer is often curable and that the survivors' population is increasing globally each year. We urge you to work with us to educate the general public in order to dispel misconceptions and myths about childhood cancer.

With the support and commitment of all stakeholders, childhood cancer survivors can be actively engaged in society and live their lives to the fullest.

Why do Childhood cancer survivors need lifelong followup?

The diagnosis of cancer is often a devastating and life-changing event, for

the child as well as family. Although the majority of childhood cancers are curable, the treatment can be intensive, involving chemotherapy as well as surgery and radiation in some cases.

Both the cancer and treatment can have many complications both during and after treatment, which can affect almost any part of the body depending on several factors. The risk of cancer recurrence is extremely low after the first 5-10 years. However, by that time, the chance of late effects increases. Studies have shown that certain complications such as heart problems, thyroid problems and some second cancers can even develop 20-30 years after treatment. Childhood cancer survivors may also have a higher chance of developing complications like diabetes, high blood pressure and high cholesterol levels. Late effects in most survivors are minor, but they can sometimes be potentially dangerous Therefore, it is very important to monitor for these complications, which can be detected and treated early. The good news is that recent treatment regimens cause less side effects.

Prevention is better than Cure: What can childhood cancer survivors do?

It is not possible to reverse the fact that you were diagnosed with cancer as a child and have received treatment. However, there are some things that you can do to minimise late effects:

Maintain a healthy and normal lifestyle.

· Undergo regular medical followup and report anything unusual in your health.

· Always, always maintain a positive outlook remember that as a victor of childhood cancer, you are a constant source of inspiration to children undergoing treatment and their families.

· Support groups of cancer survivors, such as Ugam help in many ways.

HEALTH INSURANCE ISSUES OF CHILDHOOD CANCER SURVIVORS

Advances in all fields of oncology have led to an improvement in outcomes and in the majority of pediatric malignancies, the 5-year survival rates approach 80%. This has resulted in an increasing focus on the late effects of therapy and quality of life in the growing population of childhood cancer survivors(Ref: Indian J Cancer 2015;52:219-23)

International Scenario: Insurance Acts

United States of America: The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act(PPACA) nicknamed Obamacare. The provision states that Insurance companies can no longer refuse coverage based on pre existing conditions, expanding healthcare coverage to millions of people who previously could not attain health insurance for this reason(https://obamacarefacts.com/pre-existingconditions)

Indian Scenario: The scenario in India is completely different. Cancer survivors in India are reinsured provided they had an already existing policy before the diagnosis. If a survivor opts for a fresh health insurance for the first time post treatment he is denied coverage.

Why is there a need for insurance cover to childhood cancer survivors?

Childhood Cancer Survivors are in desperate need of insurance as they have their whole lives ahead of them in which they may face any cancer or non cancer related issue also for which they should get coverage to live a fruitful productive life fearlessly. As the possibility of relapse is high for the first 5 years from diagnosis, it is not feasible for the insurance company to cover such high risk individuals as the situation is still unclear. However the relapse rates for childhood cancer survivors post 5 years from diagnosis is low(less than 5%) making them secure candidates to avail a health insurance. Since the IRDA has not specifically permanently excluded cancer survivors from getting covered (www.irda.gov.in), Ugam members (strength of more than 250 members) can approach insurance companies/IRDA to consider specific proposals for cancer survivors which makes them eligible with no discrimination in premiums after a specified period or makes them eligible for a group insurance where the risk is diluted.



Rakesh Chaudhary


